From the desk of REV FRANCIS KHOO

As we crossed the threshold into 2011, the Lord gave us a Word which we had faithfully released at our New Year's Eve Watchnight Service.

As I pondered on it and deliberated on how we should respond as a Ministry, God reminded me of a vision He had given me on 1st November 2010 wherein I saw 2 waves. The first was a deluge of blessings, opportunities, finances and material wealth. This was followed by a second wave of evil. The Lord had then given us a time frame of 6 months to *Set in Order** the things that need to be done to prepare for what is to come.



He also reminded me of conversations I had previously with leaders of other faiths. When I had asked for an honest opinion on their thoughts about Christians, their reply was "you all are very good at raising money and building nice Churches." When pressed further, they added "you all are no different from us as you Christians have the same problems as us." What an indictment! Where did we go so wrong since the days of the early primitive Christian Church? Have we lost our focus while waiting too long for Jesus to return? Have we just focused on constructing nice church buildings that we have lost our true objectives? Did Jesus die for lifeless institutions or for us humans whom He loves?

As I studied the Book of Acts, I was shown a different model from the Church that we see today. It was about people living in great expectation of His return. People built up as they "continued steadfast in the apostles doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking bread, and in prayers." It was about a time when "fear came upon every soul: and many wonders and signs were done by the apostles." It was a time when "all that believed were together, and had all things common, and had sold their possessions and goods, and parted them to all men, as every men had need." Further Acts 2: 46-47 reveals to us that they continued "daily with

one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meal with gladness and singleness of heart. Praising God, and having favour with all the people. And the Lord added to the Church daily such as should be saved." No wonder when the gospel arrived in Corinth and Ephesus, it is believed that within 6 months, more than 50% of the cities were saved.

Is this possible in this day and age of materialism, information technology advancement and globalisation when men have become "lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, traitors, heady, high minded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God...having a form of godliness but denying the power thereof... ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of truth?" But God through the Apostle Paul in 2 Timothy 3 has already warned us that people will become like these in the last days. We have to turn back to the Word that reminds us that "all scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be prefect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works."

God has already prepared His solution for these days. The Lord then brought me back to meditate again on Matthew 28:17-20. That is the KEY. All authority has already been given and it is for the purpose of being sent forth to "make disciples". Yes, we need to immerse them in the nature and character of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and teach them to do what we have been commanded to do with the assurance that when we do so, Jesus will be with us always!

We need to go back to the Jesus model. Discipleship is not about building big churches, but building individuals to maturity through close accountable relationships as Jesus did. Jesus started with 12, that became 70, then 120; and under the anointing and tutelage of the Holy Spirit, we saw 3,000 and 5,000 being added to the Kingdom.

Can you just imagine what would happen to the Church of Jesus Christ if the majority of those who follow Jesus were matured through intimate, accountable relationships centered on the essentials of God's Word? Self-initiating, reproducing disciples of Jesus would be the result with Kingdom Explosion through multiplication and replicating expression.

This was the vision that God gave us, leading to the establishment of a Certificate and Diploma curriculum in our Covenant Vision School of Ministry 4 years ago. It was this same vision that also led to the establishing of Covenant Vision Christian Church in 2008. We are now on the threshold of launching various Discipleship initiatives starting with Discipleship Groups. Many more things are still in the pipeline.

Time is running short before Jesus' return. The fields are indeed white unto harvest, but the labourers are few. We need to enlarge the place of our tent. Come join us as we endeavour to equip a chosen generation, to reach lost nations, and to transform our world for Jesus!

May God bless you, your family and all that you do in all ways, in all things and at all times!

were suddenly interrupted by a road sign and junction I didn't expect at all. Instinctively, I turned left; only to realise it was the opposite to where I wanted to go. Not good! As I looked for a U-turn, I saw the heavy traffic jam on the opposite side of the road. I had no choice but to join the jam because of this wrong turn.

However, that was not to be at all. The jam was a long queue of cars waiting to turn into another highway. So, I drove past the long line, hoping to re-connect with the highway I missed. I couldn't find it at all. Instead, I found myself getting onto an old, old road, yet heading in the correct general direction. Then I glanced to the left and saw myself driving parallel to the highway (the one I should be on), as well as the very slow and heavy traffic on it. But there I was, zipping down this old side road at guite a speed. Praise God for the wrong turn which turned out to be right in the end!

As I pondered this incident, I am reminded of how walking with the Lord can often be the same as this little road trip. On my own, I will do my best to plan and to ensure I don't get off track. I have my goals and I know what I'd want to achieve in a given time. And yet, life is so full of surprises, challenges, unseens and detours! Before I know it, I have veered off-course or taken a wrong turn ... again! If I don't have the assurance or confidence that God is watching over me, can you imagine how stressful life would be? I am so, so thankful that there are no surprises where God is concerned. He knows exactly where I am at any given point in time and which direction I am headed.

Many of us know that God holds the plan. However, instead of resting in Him, far too many are overly worried that they may not be walking in that perfect plan, or that they may step out of God's will for them. Sadly, this cripples them big-time, leading some to "paralysis-byanalysis"! Sure, they plan, pray and proceed. But the moment the situation changes, doubt comes into their hearts and they begin to question themselves and God all over again.

I used to be like that until I discovered that God is really in total and perfect control. This means that even when I make a mistake or a wrong decision, my God is big enough to allow that error and still direct me back on track! My part is to keep in close touch with Him, to follow His leading and to commit everything to Him, allowing Him to direct my paths. The psalmist declares, "The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD and He delights in his way. Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down; for the LORD upholds him with His hand." Psalm 37:23-24 Notice that the one directed by the Lord can still fall, or make a mistake. But the wonderful assurance we have is that God will not allow us to be so broken

and devastated beyond hope or deliverance. Hove the promise that He will be there to pick me up again, to uphold me with His hand, to put me back on track!

No one likes detours or distractions that upset our well laid-out plans. However, as in my road adventure. I have learnt to seek the Lord for wisdom and discernment to respond accordingly. If it is a consequence of my sin or a heart issue I need to deal with, I repent, and then I wait for the next set of instructions. Then again, it might be the Lord re-directing me. In such cases, I must learn obedience and walk as He leads. How especially sweet it is when I respond in obedience that I discover a beautiful scenic route along a forgotten side road in place of a tottering traffic jam on the highway!

Our first Project Heartbeat exercise of 2011 saw us visiting all three blocks in one afternoon. We took advantage of the fact that it was the Chinese New Year season and spread the love of Jesus in the giving of an "ang pao" and a bag containing New Year goodies and oranges. Though it was raining, we believe it was God's hand in keeping the residents at home so they could receive the gifts.

It is both delightful and heart wrenching when we visit the residents. For some, the smile on their faces as they are handed the goodies mask the reality of the situation they are in. Many live in poverty and others are battling loneliness or sickness. These are especially magnified during a festive season like Chinese New Year, where fortune is sought, feasting and family reunions are a must, and merry-making is all the buzz.





One of the participants Mark Ong, who had been involved in Project Heartbeat since he and his wife Wendy had been attending the Church, shared that this time some of the old folks were comfortable enough to open up and chat. Some of these people live on their own and we are thankful for the opportunity to be able to share that Jesus loves them and that they are not alone.

As we carry on with our bi-monthly visits to the area, we pray that these residents will come to know the one true God and Jesus Christ whom He sent (John 17:3). For it is indeed God's heartbeat that none should perish and that more will come into the saving knowledge of Him.

All praise and thanks to God and the CVCC Children Ministry for organising the very first family outing for the children and their parents!












Step Up Step Out
